The planned topics and speakers of the Conference Education Program include guidelines for protection of inspectors/installers from Arc Flash incidents, IBC/NEC correlation of requirements that are not contained within the NEC, Selective Coordination technical information & issues and an Open Code Forum discussion to help inspectors understand how other jurisdictions in the State are interpreting & enforcing "gray" areas of the Code.
